Conditions of the race

Date: every Sunday.

Time: 15:00 to 15:30 UTC during winter time (16:00 to 16:30 SEC)

in summer 17:30 to 18:00 UTC during summer time (19:30 to 20:00 SEC)

Type of traffic: CW.

The race is run in two legs. Leg 1 17:30:00 - 17:44:59 UTC

Stage 2 17:45:00 - 17:59:59 UTC daylight saving time

Stage 1 15:00:00 - 15:14:59 UTC

Stage 2 15:15:00 - 15:29:59 UTC winter time

Race category: up to 100 W of power

up to 5 W of power (Stations operating in this category will indicate /Q after their tag).

Code transmitted: RSTNR Where NR is the three-digit link number.

It works with the SPRINT system. The contest is run in two stages, this indicates that per contest you can follow up

another QSO with the same station in the second leg.

either give your challenge or look for a new station with a challenge. It is up to you which tactic you choose).

Pileup can be 100W and does not need to be re-tuned.

If a pileup is logged, there are 5 points for contacting that station.

The pileup itself gets 20 points in the long term scoreboard.

Contest frequency: in the range of 3535 KHz to 3560.5 KHz.

Scoring: each valid connection counts 1 point.

For a connection to a station operating within 5W (/Q), 2 points.

For a connection with a favored station, 3 points.

the fewest points in the LOW category.)

For a connection with a pileup station, 5 points.

If a station does not submit a diary, then this connection will only be recognized if this marker appears in the diaries of the other stations at least 3 times.

Since it happens that stations write the wrong tag (e.g. OK1FLT and OK1FLT/Q) or (OM3KI and OM2KI), if these stations have 3 or more occurrences in their logs

I will adjust the QSOs to disallow both stations. For station OK1FLT, if he sends a log and it is clear that he gave /Q. For other stations,

that are new to the contest, I'll check to see if they were in the contest at all.

There are no multipliers and the result of the contest is determined by a simple sum of points.

The time must be given in UTC with an accuracy of plus or minus 1 minute.

After the race: on the frequency 3535 to 3538 Khz, a recording will be made. From 16:05 to 16:08 UTC (18:05 - 18:08 UTC), transmit with your tag with the power you used in the contest. This will be recorded and posted on the web. This is for your reference on the quality of your antennas and signals.

Please put your brand in the subject line. Attach your comment to the subject line.

Please send the diary in Cabrillo or TXT format.

Race evaluation: diaries are accepted until Monday 11:00 UTC (12:00 local time).

Note: The codes submitted are the same as in the CQ WPX race. Therefore, this setup should work.

The evaluation will be on Monday after 14:00 UTC (16:00 local time).
